PRAYER**

O Lord our God, creator and ruler of the universe.

The sea roars, the floods clap their hands; the hills sing together for joy, for you judge the world with righteousness and the peoples with equity. All the ends of the earth have seen your victory!

You are holy, O God, and blessed is Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord.

There is no greater love than the love revealed to us in Christ Jesus, who taught us to love one another even as he has loved us, and who laid down his own life in love for the world.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Let us proclaim the mystery of our faith.
